



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Launch Automator in your Applications folder



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad


## Choose Workflow



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Select Files & Folder and then double-click on Ask for Finder Items - click Allow Multiple Selection


Multiple selection allows you to process more than one file at a time by selecting while holding the shift key down.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Choose PDFs and Apply Quartz Filter to PDF Documents


Choose PDFs on the left and double-click on Apply Quartz Filter to PDF Documents. A prompt will appear. Choose Add.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Choose where you want your new smaller PDFs to be created.


Desktop is the default, press and choose another folder where you want your files created.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Setup the Quartz Filter Settings


Click Advanced options



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad


## Duplicate the Reduce File Size Filter

Click on the drop down arrow and choose Duplicate Filter. Give the filter a name - in this case 144 DPI



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad


Press the arrows to the left of the filter to show all of the parameters



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Set the parameters for Image Sampling


Starting values are 144 for Resolution and Max 1024. Min is 128 and set Quality to HIGH.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Scroll down and set the Image Compression settings


Set these to JPEG and centered.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Press Command S and save your workflow.


Save your file and then close advance options by clicking on the arrow to the left.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Choose your filter from the popup


NOTE: If your filter is not found, quit and run Automator again and reload your workflow from the File->Open Recent menu.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Choose 144 DPI


Make sure your filter is shown.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## You're done! Run your workflow!

Press the Run button on the top right to run your workflow and process your files. When Automator asks you what files to choose, hold down the shift key to select multiple files.



# Making PDFs smaller for iPad

## Choose your files and process!

Use the shift key and select files and press choose. **Your files will be saved in the folder you chose in the Copy Finder Items step.**
